IOTIC's Roles

Work with the Tsunami Service Providers (TSPs), the National Tsunami Warning Centres (NTWCs), and the National **Disaster Management Offices (NDMOs) in** the Indian Ocean Region to promote and sensitize information on tsunami early warning system and the understanding of the warning process and products.

Supports Indian Ocean member states at national and community level to strengthen awareness and preparedness for an effective emergency response to a tsunami early warning system through i.e UNESCO IOC Tsunami Ready.

Capacity building and develop education, awareness, and preparedness materials for an **effective tsunami early warning and Mitigation** System.

Manage post-event performance surveys and compilation of reports in close collaboration with the ICG/IOTWS Secretariat under the overall direction of the ICG/IOTWS Steering Group, assisted by teams of experts nominated by the ICG/IOTWS Steering Group as required.

Coordinate activities, exchange materials and information with other Tsunami Information Centres (TICs) from other ocean basins.

48 Indian Ocean communities (26 in India and 22 in Indonesia) received Tsunami Ready Recognition from UNESCO-IOC.


