Historically a fishing village, Cascais became a royal retreat in the 19th century and remains a top destination in Portugal for visitors looking for sun, sea and sophistication.

The venue is located within a 12-minute walking distance from Cascais train station.

The closest bus stop is Igreja Matriz (served by bus line M27), just 1-minute walk to the event location.

Other nearby stops include Cascais Train Station (served by M04, M05, M09, M15, M43) and Cascais Bus Terminal (served by M02, M06, M07, M08, M11, M12, M13, M14, M17, M18, M22), which is approximately 17 minutes on foot from the venue.

Transportation

From Lisbon Airport (Humberto Delgado – LIS):

- By public transport: Metro red line to Alameda → change to green line (direction Cais do Sodré) → train from Cais do Sodré to Cascais (Linha de Cascais, approx. 40 minutes).
- By taxi or ride-hailing service (Uber/Bolt): 30–40 minutes.
- Contact your hotel for pre-arranged transfers if needed.

Ground Transportation:

- Taxis & Ride-hailing apps: Widely available
- **Bus:** Cascais is served by several MobiCascais bus lines connecting the town center, train station, and surrounding areas. To plan a route using the city's public transportation, please use the **MobiCascais mobile app.** Transport tickets can be purchased at major bus stops, at the Cascais train station, or via the MobiCascais app. It's important to note that only cash payments are accepted on board.

- Cascais Marina walk, dine and watch the boats
- Condes de Castro Guimarães Museum history & art in a palace
- Parque Marechal Carmona peaceful gardens in the town center
- Praia da Rainha & Praia do Guincho from cozy coves to surfing waves
- Casa das Histórias Paula Rego museum dedicated to the famous artist

Day Trips & Nearby Attractions

- Sintra (25 min): Palácio da Pena, Quinta da Regaleira, historic village
- Lisbon (30–40 min): Belém, Baixa-Chiado, Bairro Alto, Alfama
- Cabo da Roca: The westernmost point of continental Europe
