Subject: IOC Ocean Data and Information System (ODIS) Steering Group:

Call for nominations for Members

In its <u>Decision A-33/3.4.2</u>, the IOC Assembly at its 33rd session decided to revise the terms of reference for the IOC Ocean Data and Information System (ODIS) Programme Component of IODE and the terms of reference of the ODIS Steering Group.

The IOC ODIS Programme serves to coordinate the organisations that constitute the ODIS Federation (https://odis.org), each sharing interoperable (meta)data to advance global ocean data and information exchange. Since its inception, ODIS has grown in scale and complexity. It now requires strategic guidance as well as clearer focus to evolve the system.

Recognising these new needs, the IOC Assembly outlined a way forward in its decision above which included new terms of reference for the ODIS steering group (see Annex 2 of the Decision A-33/3.4.2 – link here above).

The ODIS Steering Group will play an important role in evolving the work of ODIS and setting in place the priorities and work plan in line with its mandates, as well as in line with the work of the IOC, including its medium-term strategy and data architecture, the Global Ocean Observing System (GOOS), IODE, relevant UN entities, work under the UN Ocean Decade and wider data community.

With this letter, representatives of Member States, NODCs, ADUs, United Nations entities, as well as governmental and intergovernmental organisations are **invited to nominate experts for the ODIS Steering Group**. Self-nominations will also be possible to encourage nominations from non-governmental entities. You are invited to forward this letter to the national entities you deem relevant.

This invitation will also be circulated to:

- Scientific and operational networks connected with IODE;
- Dedicated ocean policy, business, and sustainable development networks via UN Ocean Decade mailing lists;
- As well as shared on IODE and IOC mailing lists and social media.

Nominees will be assessed against the following criteria:

- Experience in planning (inter)national or regional data strategies;
- Knowledge of multi-year / decadal data strategies relevant to open data and data sharing;
- Experience in cutting edge innovation, technology or data infrastructure development;
- Experience heading/managing open data and data sharing systems, particularly improving interoperability at the regional and global levels;
- Resource sourcing and management;
- Familiarity with the UN and intergovernmental processes.

The IOC Secretariat will thoroughly review all submissions, and the Executive Secretary will appoint members, based on expertise, geographic, generational, and gender balance by 30 November 2025.

The Steering Group will consist of a maximum of 15 members serving on a voluntary basis. English is the working language for all Steering Group meetings, and most meetings (up to 4 annual meetings) will be held online. The co-chairs will be elected following the first meeting and might be requested to represent the steering group in-person at the biennial IODE Committee meeting. Commitment to the steering group is one year with the possibility of extension, however invitees are requested to consider at least a two-year commitment if possible.

The IODE Secretariat invites nominations to be submitted not later than <u>24 October 2025</u>.
